Entry Requirements

- Class 2 medical certificate
- Operational restrictions on the Schweizer 300CBI require students to weigh less than 105 kg and to be in good physical health
- CASA Commercial Pilot Licence
- Flight Assessment
- Interview
- Minimum 250 hours total flight time including 100 PIC, OR
- Low level rating with helicopter endorsement with either night VFR rating on helicopter, OR
- Instrument rating on helicopter
